1. DISCLAIMERS

- a. Qualified and eligible candidates are required to register ONLINE on the TN medical selection committee website <u>https://tnmedicalselection.org</u>to participate in the counselling process for allotment of seat. TN medical selection committee does not allot any seat manually. (For all General Category Seats)
- b. Candidates are deemed to have read, agreed and accepted this Prospectus and the terms and conditions of the counselling mentioned in this prospectus for TN State 2023-2024 UG (MBBS/BDS) Counselling on completing the online submission of application form.
- c. Application for TN State 2023-2024 UG(MBBS/BDS) Counselling can only be submitted online through Medical Counselling Committee websitehttps://tnmedicalselection.org Application submitted through any other mode shall not be entertained.
- d. Candidates are further advised to fill the application form on their own on the TN Medical Selection Committee website and not through any agent or third party. If they have any difficulty in filling up the online application forms they can approach the facilitation centres at any one of the nearest Government Medical Colleges / Tamil Nadu Government Dental College and the T.F.C. (Tamil Nadu Facilitation Centre) in each District (where there are no Medical Colleges yet) and utilise the facilities to access and apply online.

Working hours and time: 28.06.2023 to 10.07.2023 (10:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M)

- e. A candidate can submit Tamil Nadu State 2023-2024 UG (MBBS/BDS) Government quota application form only once. He/She may apply for Management quota (If willing) separately
- f. The Security Deposit will be forfeited if a candidate who has been allotted a seat in the Second Round or subsequent rounds and does not join the respective institution. Also, the Security Deposit will be forfeited if the admission gets cancelled due to any reason. E.g. in case the candidate gives wrong information at the time of registration on the basis of which a seat may be allotted and later cancelled by the Admission Authorities at the time of reporting or fails to produce the required documents at the time of admission (within stipulated time).
- g. Candidate may kindly note that registering for TN State 2023-2024 UG(MBBS/BDS) Counselling does not confer any automatic rights to secure an Under Graduate seat. The selection and admission to Under Graduate seats in any medical Institution recognized for running Under Graduate courses as per Indian Medical Council Act,

- 1956 and is subject to fulfilling the merit, admission criteria, eligibility, and such criteria as may be prescribed by the respective universities, medical institutions, National Medical Council/Dental Council of India, and State/Central Government.
- h. Candidate should ensure that all information filled during the online submission of application form are correct and factual. Information provided by the candidates in the online application/registration form shall be treated as correct and self-certified and Tamil Nadu Medical Selection Committee shall not entertain, under any circumstances, any request for change in the information provided by the candidates.
- i. The information regarding Fee structure/ Course Content / bond / rendering of service in rural / tribal area/other conditions etc. has been provided by Medical / Dental Colleges. Tamil Nadu Medical Selection Committee takes no responsibility regarding the above information including Fees/ Bond/ Mode of Payment or any typographical error/ data etc. Candidates are advised to visit College website or contact the College Authorities directly for any query regarding above information before filling choices. Choices once locked cannot be modified and any request to Selection Committee regarding change of choices will not be entertained.
- j. Candidates are advised to confirm their eligibility status before registering on the Selection Committee website for Institutional/Minority Quota seats of Minority Institutions/ IRT ward/CMC, Vellore before opting for their seats.
- k. It is informed that the fees for UG for Government Quota in self- Financing seats should be in accordance with fees prescribed by the Fee Fixation Committee as mentioned in clause 22. For any grievance regarding high exorbitant fees, candidates are requested to send their grievance through mail to the following E-Mail id.ddugselcom@gmail.com for reporting to the concerned authorities. But the selection committee will not be responsible for any non-compliance by the concerned colleges.
- I. Candidates are advised to be in touch with the Tamil Nadu Medical Selection Committee website (<u>https://tnmedicalselection.net/</u>) for Schedule / latest updates / Results / Notices / News & Events pertaining to counselling as Selection Committee will not be individually contacting the candidates for the same.
- m. No communication will be directly sent to the Candidate(s). They are advised to be in touch with the website on regular basis for any updates.
- n. Candidates are advised to use the same Mobile number used by them during application process for all subsequent events of counselling since OTPs will only be sent to that mobile number.

- Court cases with regard to counselling must be within the jurisdiction of Hon'ble Madras High Court.
- p. All admissions and resignations (if permitted) should be made through online mode only. Offline resignation of seats is **NOT** permitted.
- q. Candidates must download the allotment letter from the Selection Committee website only.
- r. The security amount will be refunded to the account (If eligible)as specified by the candidate in the online application form.

2. GLOSSARY OF TERMS:


- State Quota: Refers to seats alloted by the the Tamil Nadu Medical Selection Committee (85% of Permitted/recognised seats in Government Medical/Dental Colleges and 100% Private college seats other than deemed universities). This includes GQ,MQ, NRI and NRI Lapsed seats referred below.
- 2. **All India Quota (AIQ) :** Refers to seats allotted by DGHS/MCC to students from all over India. (15% of Seats from State Government colleges).
- Selection Committee: Refers to Tamil Nadu Medical Selection Committee which is
 the selection authority for Tamil Nadu Medical/Dental/Paramedical admissions.
 Selection Committee works under the Directorate of Medical Education and
 Research, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of Tamil Nadu.
- Application: Refers to online portal application form for admission to Medical/Dental Undergraduate courses conducted by the Selection Committee for Tamil Nadu State Quota.
- 5. Application Fees :Fees paid for applying to Tamil Nadu Medical/Dental UG (MBBS& BDS) courses. This fee of Rs.500/- is non-Refundable and SC/SCA/ST candidates are exempted from payment of Application Fee.
- 6. Registration & Choice Locking: Refers to process of online filling up of the Counselling registration form, Paying the requisite fees, Locking their preferred choices to participate in Tamil Nadu Medical Counselling. Candidates can register for Counselling before the Round 1, Mop-Up Round & Stray Round. Fresh Registration is not allowed for Round 2.

- 7. **Registration Fees**: Fees paid for registering in the counselling process. This fee of Rs.500/- is non-refundable.
- 8. **General Category**: Refers to seats allotted to candidates who do not belong to any special category (i.e Persons with Benchmark Disabilities, Eminent Sports Persons, Children of Exservice Men or Special Preferential 7.5% Reservation to Government School Students)
- Special category: Refers to seats allotted to candidates who belong to any one of the special categories (i.e Persons with Benchmark Disabilities, Eminent Sports Persons, Children of Exservice Men or Special Preferential 7.5% Reservation to Government School Students)
- 10. Government Quota (GQ): Refers to seats alloted by the Tamil Nadu Medical Selection Committee under Government Quota. This includes seats in all Govt. Medical/Dental Colleges and a proportion of seats in Self-Financing Medical/Dental Colleges & (50% or more) under Government Quota.
- 11. Management Quota (MQ): Refers to proportion of seats in Self Financing Medical/Dental Colleges & which are under Management Quota (35% or Less). These seats will have a higher fee structure compared to GQ seats.
- 12. NRI Quota: Refers to proportion of seats in Self Financing Medical/Dental Colleges& which are reserved for NRI candidates (15% of SF college seats).
- 13. **PWD quota**: Refers to seats reserved for Persons with benchmark Disability (5% of seats in all instituitions). Candidates should have submitted PWD certificate obtained from the regional Medical Board, RGGGH, Chennai-03.
- 14. **Ex-Servicemen Quota**: Refers to the Seats Reserved for the Children of Ex-Servicemen in Government Medical/Dental College (M.B.B.S. 10 & B.D.S. 1) as explained in Clause 14.2.
- 15. **Sports Quota**: Refers to Seats Reserved for Eminent Sports Person in Government Medical/Dental College (M.B.B.S 7 and B.D.S.- 1)as explained in Clause 14.3.
- 16. **7.5% Special Preferential Quota**: Refers to 7.5% of seats in the admission to M.B.B.S/BDS which are reserved on preferential basis to students, who have completed their scholling from VI to XII in State Government schools and qualified NEET-UG 2023.
- 17. **Merit/Rank List**: Refers to the State Merit List published by the Selection Committee based on the NEET score among the applied candidates.


- 18. Security Deposit :Fees paid at the time of registration for counselling especially if candidate wishes to opt for GQ seats in Self-Financing colleges/ MQ/NRI Quota of Self-Financing colleges. This has been made necessary to avoid seat blocking. Security Deposit will be refunded if the candidate is not allotted seats in any of the rounds or if the candidate joins the allotted seat. Security deposit will be forfeited if the candidate does not join the allotted course in Round 2 or later rounds or if he/she discontinues the allotted course in any round.
- 19. Allotment: Refers to a candidate being allotted a seat based on his choice preferred and on the basis of Merit & Rule of Reservation. Allotment does not confer the rights on the seat unless the candidate pays the prescribed Tuition Fees and downloads the Allotment order within the stipulated time and joins the instituion within the specified period.
- 20. **Allotment Order**: Refers to the Provisional Allotment Orders issued by the Selection Committee which the candidate downloads from the website after payment of necessary Fees. This order is mandatory for joining the allotted institute.
- 21. **Joining**: Refers to the candidate, after downloading the Allotment order reports to the institution with the original documents and joins the institute. (Round 1 & 2). In Mop-up & Stray round, payment of fees and downloading the allotment order itself is considered as Joining.(Considering the absence of Reallotment and Time-Constraints)
- 22. **Resignation**: Refers to the candidate after joining the course, resigning the course for his/her own reasons. This has to be done online only via Selection Committee website and they have to download the resignation form and submit it to the College for them to get back their original certificates.
 - Note: Only in Round 1, resignation constitutes Free exit. Resignation in subsequent rounds is considered as Discontinuation of course. This will result in Forfeiture of Security Deposit and Tuition Fee and payment of Discontinuation Fee.
- 23. Free Exit: Refers to candidate having free choice in quitting/not joining their allotted course in Round 1 before the stipulated date without any adverse condition upon them. This contrasts with provisions like Forfeiture of Fees & Security Deposit or Discontinuation fee or debarment from participation in counselling which a candidate

- has to face(as the case may be) if he/she quits or not join the course after the stipulated date in Round 1 or anytime after allottment in subsequent rounds.
- 24. **Forfeiture**: If the candidate does not join the allotted course in Round 2 or later rounds he/she shall forfeit their security deposit and Tuition Fees paid(if any)
- 25. **Discontinuation Fee**: If the candidate discontinues the course after the stipulated date in Round 1 or resigns after joining, any time later, in subsequent rounds he is considered as Discontinued and is liable to pay Discontinuation Fee as mentioned in clause 23.
- 26. **Not Joined**: Refers to the candidate who after being allotted has not joined the institution. In round 1 Not-Joined status offers free exit. But in Round 2 Not-Joined status results in Forfeiture of Security Deposit and tuition fees paid(If any).
 - In Mop-Up & Stray rounds if the candidate downloads allotment order he/she is considered as joined. If after allotted he does not download allotment order he/she is not eligible to participate in further rounds of counselling in addition to forfeiture of Security Deposit & Tuition Fees(if any)
- 27. Virtual Vacancy: Refers to the vacancies which may arise due to reallotment/upgradation of seats in the round 2. Candidates can fill their choices for such seats but they will become real vacancies and be available for allotment only if the candidate who holds such seat and has applied for reallotment / upgradation gets reallotment and vacates such seat.


A. Process of Online MBBS_BDS Application – State of Tamil Nadu

3.IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

- 1) For Periodic updates, the candidates are instructed to remain in touch with the official websites, https://tnhealth.tn.gov.in and www.tnmedicalselection.org frequently from the date of application till the end of admission process.
- 2) Selection Committee will not be responsible for the consequences, resulting due to non-diligent follow-up of notices, notifications and publications appearing on the websites regarding counselling and admission to MBBS / BDS Degree Courses for 2023-2024 academic year.
- 3) Rank List will be available in the official websites and results WILL NOT BE COMMUNICATED individually. The applicants are thus encouraged to view the website for all updates.
- 4) Any change or modification and relevant information pertaining to this counselling / admission process will be made available on the official websites.
- 5) Candidates are advised to download the prospectus and read it carefully along with parents / guardian before filling the online application form and ensure that no mandatory column is left blank. In the event of rejection of the application form, any correspondence and request for re-consideration will NOT be entertained.
- 6) Candidates are advised to read the Information Bulletin for NEET-UG 2023 issued by the National Testing Agency (NTA) and carefully go through the instructions regarding NEET UG - 2023 and visit the website https://neet.nta.nic.in/ regarding detailed qualifying criteria.
- 7) If a candidate is unable to access the online application, then he / she can appear in person with parent / guardian, with all the original certificates at any one of the nearest Government Medical Colleges / Tamil Nadu Government Dental College and the T.F.C. (Tamil Nadu Facilitation Centre) and utilise the facilities to access and apply online.
 - Working hours and time: 28.06.2023 to 10.07.2023 (10:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M)
- 8) This prospectus is applicable for Government Medical / Dental Colleges, Government Quota seats in Self-Financing Medical / Dental Colleges and ESIC Medical College, K.K. Nagar, Chennai affiliated to the Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University.
- 9) The online submission of application form for admission to MBBS / BDS Degree Courses 2023-2024 session in Tamil Nadu Government Medical / Dental Colleges, Government seats in Self- Financing Medical / Dental Colleges and ESIC Medical College, K.K. Nagar, Chennai affiliated to the Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University can be accessed from the following official websites:

- 10) The admissions in the State of Tamil Nadu are as per the provisions of relevant Acts and Rules framed by the Government of Tamil Nadu and in compliance to Section 14 of the National Medical Commission Act, 2019 and as per the orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and the eligibility for admission to MBBS / BDS Degree Courses within the respective categories shall be based solely on marks obtained in the National Eligibility-Cum-Entrance Test (NEET UG – 2023).
 - Candidates who participate in MBBS/BDS counselling must qualify in NEET Examination (for the current academic year 2023-2024).
- 11) As per Clause 6.1.6(a)(ii)of the NEET Information Bulletin 2023 issued by the National Testing Agency, the reservation of the seats in Medical / Dental Colleges for respective categories shall be applicable as per laws prevailing in the State / Union Territory concerned.
- 12) From the total number of MBBS / BDS seats available in the Government Medical / Dental Colleges, 15% of the seats are surrendered to All India Quota and the remaining 85% of seats are allotted to State Quota for the academic year 2023-2024; whereas in Government Erode Medical College and Hospital, Perundurai, Erode District, the Government has sanctioned an annual intake of 100 students of which 30 seats are earmarked for the wards of employees of the State Transport Corporation and Institute of Road Transport Corporation members who are contributing to the Corpus Fund and 15%(15 seats) surrendered to All India Quota and the remaining 55 seats are allotted to State Quota(General Pool)
- 13) Seat sharing with Self-Financing Minority and Non Minority Medical / Dental Colleges will be as per State Policy and National Medical Commission / Dental Council of India regulations and applicable court orders.
- 14) Christian Medical College seats will be filled as per the Judgement issued by the Supreme Court of India in paragraph 9 of I.A.No.110584/2022 in W.P.(c). No.8/2022 as follows,
 - 30% seats of Christian Medical College, Vellore will be filled by the State Government following its policy of reservation strictly in accordance with the Government Quota Merit List.
 - For 20% of seats of Christian Medical College, Vellore will be filled from the candidates who are native of Tamil Nadu and belonging to Christian Minority in accordance with the Christian Minority Merit List and candidates who are eligible to

claim Christian seats which is a notified minority community as per Section 2 (c) of National Commission for Minorities Act, 1992 should produce a certificate issued by the competent revenue authority of the candidate's native jurisdiction **Annexure** - XV.

- The Remaining 50% of seats are earmarked for admission under CMC Quota for which admissions will be made by the Selection Committee based on the criteria given by the management of CMC. Details are given in the MQ Prospectus
- 15) Special Category (Children of Ex-Servicemen, Eminent Sports Person and Persons with Benchmark Disabilities) and admission on preferential basis (7.5 percentage) to students of government schools as per the Tamil Nadu Admission to Undergraduate Courses in Medicine, Dentistry, Indian Medicine and Homeopathy Act, 2020(Tamil Nadu Act No.34 of 2020) will be done ahead of General Category. The venue for Special Category counselling will be intimated later.
- 16) Special Category candidates (i.e., Eminent Sports Person and Children of Ex-Servicemen) are instructed to pay an additional amount of Rs.100/- via Bank payment portal.
- 17) At the time of registration, the candidate must pay Security Deposit as follows:
 - (i) For Government Medical Colleges Nil
 - (ii) For Government Dental Colleges Nil
 - (iii) For Government Quota seats in

 Self-Financing Medical / Dental College– Rs.30, 000/
 (if candidate wishes to choice lock government quota seats in self financing colleges and)

Security Deposit will be refunded to the candidates after joining the allotted colleges at the end of all phases of counselling and to the candidates who have not got any seats during any phase of counseling. (Within 2 months of completion of the entire counseling process)

Security Deposit will not be refunded for the candidates who have not-joined the course in Round II or later rounds or who discontinue the course beyond the stipulated date in Round I or in later rounds and they will also have to forfeit the Registration fee and tuition fee.

"SC/SCA/ST candidates Exempted from Security deposit if annual Income is less than 2.5 Lakhs and Converts to Christianity from Scheduled Caste, candidates Exempted from Security deposit if annual Income is less than 2.0 Lakhs."

- 18) Each round of counselling is a separate round and the rules of each round are different. Once any round commences, the rules of that round will apply to all the candidates even if they are allotted/admitted in the previous round(s) of counselling. The rules of round 1 will only apply to rules of round 1. Once round 2 commences the rules of Round 2 shall apply and the rules of round 1 will not apply. Similarly, the rules of Mop-Up round will apply in Mop-up round and the rules of Stray Vacancy round will apply on stray vacancy round.
 - 19) Instructions in the Prospectus are subject to changes based on decisions taken by the Government of Tamil Nadu and as per the instructions of the Hon'ble Courts and DGHS/MCC and will be amended from time to time and such amendments will be treated as part of this Government order. Candidates are therefore advised to regularly check the official websites till the end of counselling for any updates.

4.GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS: -

(a) Candidates seeking admission to MBBS / BDS Degree Courses in Tamil Nadu Government Medical / Dental Colleges, Government seats in Self-Financing Medical / Dental Colleges and ESIC Medical College, K. K. Nagar, Chennai affiliated to the Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University in can access the application form from the following official websites.

- (b) Candidates should submit their filled in online application form after uploading the details in the required fields. The cost of application form is Rs.500/- (Rupees Five Hundred Only) (non-refundable) and should be paid through online Bank payment portal in the websites. The candidates applying under Special category for Eminent Sports Person and Children of Ex-Sevicemen should pay an additional fee of Rs.100/- (non-refundable) for each special category via Bank payment portal.
- (c) All Scheduled Caste/ Scheduled Caste (Arunthathiyar) / Scheduled Tribe candidates of Tamil Nadu native are EXEMPTED from payment of the cost of the application.
- (d) The last date for submission of online application form will be upto 5:00 P.M. on 10.07.2023. Thereafter there is no provision for the candidates to submit their online application form.
- (e) Candidates should fill up all mandatory columns, upload all required documents and submit the duly filled in online application. The candidates may download their filled in online application form and secure a copy of the same for their future reference.

- (f) The Candidates should submit the filled in online application after filling up of all fields with all relevant documents submitted/ uploaded along with application. Subsequent submission of supporting document/(s), is not accepted either on courier/ post/ or in person.
- (g) Admission under State quota seats will also include admission on preferential basis (7.5 percentage) as per the Tamil Nadu Admission to Undergraduate Courses in Medicine, Dentistry, Indian Medicine and Homeopathy on preferential basis to students of Government Schools Act, 2020 (Tamil Nadu Act No.34 of 2020).
- (h) Candidateswho seek admission under preferential admission of 7.5% of seats under Government School Quota in MBBS/BDS courses should obtain and upload a bonafide certificate from the school last studied from the Headmaster/Headmistress and counter signed by the Chief Education Officer in the prescribed format for their studying 6th standard to 12th standard. The prescribed format is annexed as Annexure II in this prospectus.
- (i) In case, candidates come under the clause (h) above, have studied in more than one Government school, they should produce the bonafide certificate from the current / last studied school covering the details of the schools studied earlier also.
- (j) The bonafide certificate furnished by the students will be scrutinised by the Selection Committee. If any discrepancies are found during counselling or at any later stage on the bonafide certificate, the admission of the candidate will be cancelled without any intimation. The decision of the Selection Committee in such matters shall be final and binding.
- (k) If seats are vacant in any category after the exhaustion of merit list (From that specific category), those seats will be converted to general category in the subsequent round.

5. INSTRUCTION FOR SPECIAL CATEGORY - (PwD, Sports and Ex-Servicemen):

The candidates applying under Special categories viz., Persons with Benchmark Disabilities and Children of Ex-servicemen are instructed to submit their application in online only.

For, Eminent Sports persons are instructed to submit their application both in online and offline mode and submit the downloaded filled in online application along with two sets of enclosures on or before 10.07.2023 **in person** only to the below mentioned address.

- (a) Candidates seeking admission under Special Category Persons with Benchmark Disabilities should submit a separate Special Category Form which is in Annexure V and enclose the relevant certificates and Medical Certificate issued by the Regional Medical Board – Rajiv Gandhi Government General Hospital, Chennai of their online application. If the photocopy of the Regional Medical Board Certificate is not enclosed, then the application will be considered under General Category only, if he/she fulfils the norms for the General Category.
- (b) Candidates seeking admission for MBBS / BDS Degree Courses under Special Category - Children of Ex-Servicemen should submit a separate Special Category which is in Annexure VI along with the filled in online application form in the prescribed format provided in the Prospectus and should enclose the relevant certificates for consideration under the Special Category and an additional fee of Rs.100/- via Bank payment portal. [The wards of the Ex-Servicemen applying in this category will be allotted seats as per the G.O.(D). No.977/H& FW Dept. dated 01.06.2018 and as amended in G.O.(D). No.882/H& FW Dept. dated 28.05.2019 G.O.(D).No.33/H&FW(MCA-1) Dept. dated.10.01.2022. If the required photocopies of the certificates under Special Category – Children of Ex-Servicemen are **not uploaded**, then the application of such candidates shall be considered under General Category only, if he/she fulfils the norms for the General Category.
- (c) Candidates seeking admission under Sports Quota shall submit the separate Special Category Form which is in Annexure VII (a) & (b) along with the filled in online application form in the prescribed format and an additional fee of Rs.100/- via Bank payment portal. They should submit the relevant certificates claiming the Sports Category along with two sets of the photocopies of Educational Certificates and Sports Certificates first in online and thenin person on the date specified in the websites. If the required photocopies/Originals of the sports certificates are NOT submitted in person, then the application of such candidates shall be considered under General Category only, if he / she fulfill the norms for the General Category.
- (d) Special Category rank differs completely from that of the General Category rank.
- (e) Special Category candidates cannot claim the same rank in the General Category and vice versa.

6. AGE LIMIT (As per NEET UG - 2023 Bulletin).

The Candidates should have completed 17 years of age at the time of admission or should complete 17 years on or before 31st December of this year 2023.

7. GENERAL ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA (As per NEET UG - 2023 Bulletin):

Candidates should be a Citizen of India.

8. NATIVITY:

- Candidates should be Native of Tamil Nadu.
- b. The Candidates who claim their Nativity as Tamil Nadu, should submit their nativity certificate issued by the competent authority of Government of Tamil Nadu. NativityCertificate submitted after the deadline will be summarily rejected.
- c. Candidates belonging to other States and residing in Tamil Nadu cannot claim nativity of Tamil Nadu.
- d. Candidatewho has appeared for NEET UG 2023 as a native of other State,
 cannot apply as a native of Tamil Nadu.
- e. Permanent Residence Certificate in lieu of Nativity Certificate will not be accepted.
- f. Nativity Certificate submitted with application alone will be accepted and sending the Nativity Certificate separately will not be entertained.
- g. Candidates who are Native of Tamil Nadu and have studied from Standard VI to Standard XII in schools of Tamil Nadu should also produce Nativity Certificate and Community Certificate issued by the competent authority. The Community Certificate of either one of the parent obtained from the competent Revenue Authority of Government of Tamilnadu should be enclosed to claim Communal Reservation.
 - If candidates do not submit the above mentioned certificates and even if he/she had studied Standard VI to Standard XII completely in Tamil Nadu, the candidate will be considered under Open Category only.
- h. Candidates who are Native of Tamil Nadu, but have studied from VI Standard to XII Standard outside Tamil Nadu either partly or completely in one or more States should produce the Nativity Certificate and Community Certificate issued by the competent authority. The Community Certificate of either one of the parent obtained from the competent Revenue Authority of Government of Tamil Nadu should be enclosed to claim Communal Reservation.
 - If the candidates do not submit the above mentioned certificates, then the candidate's application willbe summarily rejected.
- i. Such candidates applying in the category 5(h) of this prospectus should also give an undertaking that they have not applied for any Educational Institution in any

other State, claiming the nativity of such State for admission. If it is found later that the candidate has applied as a native of any other State other than Tamil Nadu, then the admission will be cancelled at any stage. Further, even during the course of study if it is subsequently found that any candidate has produced a false nativity certificate or given a false undertaking, it will result in expulsion of the candidate from the course and also initiation of criminal proceedings against the candidate as well as his/her parents as per provision of the law.

NOTE: This nativity clause is subject to the outcome of the Writ Petitions (W.P.Nos.23656, 23547, 24217, 25565, 28140, 28778, 28779 and 23950 of 2017 & 29513 of 2022) pending before the Hon'ble High Court of Madras.

The candidature claimed after submission of application without Community Certificate will be treatedonly as Open category.

(b) If a candidate of Tamil Nadu origin obtains community certificate from other state, he/she will be considered under Open Categoryonly if he/she fulfils the norms otherwise.

(c) If a candidate submits a false / fabricated Community Certificate, Nativity Certificate or any other Certificate, if it is found at a later point during the course of the study, it will result in expulsion of the candidate from the course and also legal proceedings / criminal action will be initiated against the candidate and their parents as per provision of law.

10. QUALIFYING CRITERIA:

The National Testing Agency will prepare an All India Merit List of successful candidates of NEET (UG) – 2023 on the basis of the eligibility criteria provided by the National Medical Commission (erstwhile Medical Council of India) and Dental Council of India as given in erstwhile Graduate Medical Education Regulations - 1997 issued under Indian Medical Council Act - 1956 and BDS Course Regulations, 2007 issued under the Dentists Act, 1948).

The eligibility criteria are as follows:

Admission to MBBS / BDS Degree Courses for academic session (2023-24) shall be based solely on marks obtained in the National Eligibility-Cum-Entrance Test (NEET-UG 2023).

(a) In order to become eligible for admission to MBBS / BDS Courses for a particular academic year, it shall be necessary for the candidate to obtain minimum of marks at 50th percentile in National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test to MBBS / BDS Courses held for the said academic year.

However, in respect of candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Classes, the minimum marks shall be at 40th percentile.

In respect of candidates with Bench Mark Disabilities specified under the *Rights of Persons* with Disabilities Act, 2016, the minimum marks shall be at 45th percentile for unreserved category candidates and 40th percentile for SC/ST / OBC candidates.

- (b) Provided when sufficient number of candidates in the respective categories fail to secure minimum marks as prescribed in *National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test* held for any academic year for admission to MBBS / BDS Courses, the Government of India in consultation with National Medical Commission (erstwhile Board of Governors in Supersession of the Medical Council of India) and Dental Council of India may at its discretion lower the minimum marks required for admission to MBBS/BDS Courses for candidates belonging to respective categories and marks so lowered by the Government of India shall be applicable for the said academic yearonly.
- (c) To be eligible for admission to the MBBS / BDS Courses, a candidate must have passed in

the subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Biology/Bio-technology and English individually and must have obtained a minimum of 50% marks taken together in Physics, Chemistry, Botany/ Zoology / Biology / Bio-technology at the Qualifying Examination as mentioned in Graduate Medical Education Regulations-1997 as amended in 2018 and BDS Course Regulations, 2007 and in addition must have come in the merit list of *National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test* for admission to MBBS / BDS Courses. In respect of the candidates belonging to the SC, ST and OBC category, the marks obtained in Physics, Chemistry, Biology / Bio-technology taken in qualifying examination and competitive examination (Physics, Chemistry, and Biology) must be 40% marks instead of 50%. In respect of candidates with Bench Mark Disabilities specified under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, the minimum marks in qualifying examination in Physics, Chemistry and Biology/Bio-Technology taken together must be 45% instead of 50% for Unreserved category candidates and 40% for SC / ST / OBCcandidates.

(d) Candidates who have passed 10+2 from Open School or as private candidates shall not be eligible to appear for 'National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test'. Furthermore, study of Biology / Biotechnology as an Additional subject at 10+2 level also shall not be permissible.

"The proviso in italics has been subject matter of challenge before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi, Hon'ble High Court of Allahabad, Lucknow Bench and Hon'ble High Court of Madhya Pradesh at Jabalpur. The provisions of the regulations disqualifying recognised Open School Board candidates and the candidates who have studied Biology / Biotechnology as an additional subject has been struckdown. The Medical Council of India has preferred Special Leave Petitions before the Hon'ble Supreme Court. Therefore, the candidatures of candidates in the NEET (UG)-2023 who have passed the qualifying examinations i.e. 10+2 from National Institute of Open Schooling or State Open Schools or as private candidates from recognised State Boards; or with Biology / Biotechnology as additional subject shall be allowed but subject to outcome of Special Leave Petitions/Appeals filed by the Medical Council of India".

e) The candidates of other Boards / Universities / Countries (except State Board/CBSEBoard/ICSE) who wish to take up a MBBS / BDS seat in the State of Tamil Nadu should submit the Eligibility Certificate obtained from the Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Guindy, Chennai, at the time of admission of filled in online application.

11.NON-ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

- (a) The candidates, who are native of other State, studied their schooling from VI to XII in other States either wholly or in part are not eligible to apply for MBBS/BDS course.
- (b) If the candidates of other Universities / Boards (except State Board / CBSE/ ICSE) do not submit the Eligibility Certificate obtained from the Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Guindy, Chennai, then their application will be summarily rejected.
- (c) Candidates presently pursuing the MBBS course in Tamil Nadu or in other States of India or other countries are NOT ELIGIBLE to apply for the MBBS Course once again.
- (d) Candidates presently pursuing the BDS course in Tamil Nadu or in other States of India or other countries are NOT ELIGIBLE to apply for the BDS Course again.

If the seats reserved for the persons with disabilities in a particular category remain unfilled on account of unavailability of candidates, then earmarked seats would be included in the general category in the round 1 of General Category counselling.
- b. Candidates are required to visit the official websites www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in, www.tnmedicalselection.org for latest information in this regard.

Candidates with less than 40% disabilities are NOT ELIGIBLE for reservation under PWD category and if the candidates are eligible to apply for MBBS / BDS Degree Courses otherwise they will be considered under general category.

c. As per "ANNEXURE-A" published by the National Medical Commission (erstwhile Medical Council of India) in pursuance of the communication from Ministry of Health and Family Welfare as follows:

"Presence of significant Locomotor Disability with or without any other significant disability such as visual or hearing—speech or learning etc. which will make it very difficult for the candidate to pursue and complete the course satisfactorily and may significantly increase the risk to the candidate or the patient(s) — may be declared NOT ELIGIBLE for admission".

- d. The candidates are required to produce a certificate obtained from the Regional Medical Board constituted at Rajiv Gandhi Government General Hospital, Chennai-600 003 for the purpose of assessing the nature and the extent of disability in Annexure V. The certificate must have been OBTAINED WITHIN THREE SIX MONTHS PRIOR TO SUBMITTING the application for seeking admission under this category. If the certificate has been obtained earlier, then the application will be rejected. If the candidate fails to submit the Disability Medical Certificate, then their application will be rejected under special category.
- e. Candidates who consider themselves eligible for Persons with Bench Mark Disabilities Category are advised to ensure their eligibility by getting themselves examined at the Disability Assessment Board constituted at Rajiv Gandhi

Government General Hospital, Chennai and upload the disability certificate from the board along with the application failing which, the candidates will not be considered for allotment of seats under Persons with Bench Mark Disabilities.

- f. The eligibility decided as per the Rights of Persons with Benchmark Disability Act and decision from the Regional Medical Board constituted at Rajiv Gandhi Government General Hospital, Chennai-03 regarding disability assessment will be final.
- g. All the candidates who are eligible under PWD category will be ranked based on their score in NEET-UG 2023

16. METHOD OF SELECTION AND ADMISSION:

(i) The admission shall be made on the basis of National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test NEET-UG 2023 score for MBBS / BDS Degree Courses for the year 2023-2024 through Single Window system following the rule of reservation for the State Quota seats in Government Medical / Dental Colleges, Government Quota seats in Self Financing Private Medical / Dental Colleges and ESIC Medical College, K.K.Nagar, Chennai affiliated to The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University.

- (ii) Merely appearing and qualifying in NEET (UG) 2023 does not confer any right to the candidate for admission to MBBS / BDS Courses. The selection and admission to MBBS / BDS course in any Medical Institution recognised for MBBS / BDS Courses is subject to fulfilling the admission criteria, eligibility, rank in merit list, medical fitness and such other criteria as may be prescribed by the Government of India, Government of Tamilnadu and TN DR.M.G.R. Medical University.
- (iii) Candidate's eligibility for MBBS / BDS Courses is purely provisional and is subject to fulfillment of eligibility criteria as prescribed by the Government of Tamil Nadu as applicable.
- (iv) The Government Orders issued and to be issued from time to time pertaining to any of the matters contained in this prospectus should be read as part and parcel of this Prospectus and such terms and conditions in the Government Order are deemed to have been incorporated in this Prospectus.

17. ROUNDS OF ONLINE COUNSELLING:

There are four rounds of counselling

- 1. Round 1
- 2. Round 2
- 3. Mop up Round
- 4. Stray Round

I. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR COUNSELLING:

At the time of registration of counselling, the candidate must pay Security Deposit as follows:

CATEGORY A, A1 and C:

(i) For Government Medical Colleges – Nil(ii) For Government Dental Colleges – Nil

CATEGORY B and D:

(iii) For Government Quota seats in

Self-Financing Medical / Dental College-Rs.30, 000/-

"SC/SCA/ST candidates Exempted from Security deposit if annual Income is less than 2.5 Lakhs and Converts to Christianity from Scheduled Caste, candidates are Exempted from Security deposit if annual Income is less than 2.0 Lakhs."

a) The counselling Schedule will be available in the official Websites.

- b) Candidates are instructed to register and Choice lock the seats for each round of counselling within the stipulated date and time as mentioned in the counselling Schedule.
- c) Once the candidate locks his/her choices during the online counselling, it cannot be changed later.
- d) Admission to MBBS/BDS course shall be made by online counselling on the basis of rank by applying the rules of reservation based on the preference of Choices given by the candidate.
- e) Candidates are advised not to share Login ID, Password and OTP with others.
- f) Mutual transfer/Individual request for transfer of college will NOT be permitted under any circumstances.
- g) Provisionally selected candidates can download the provisional allotment order by paying the tuition fee as mentioned in clause 22.
- h) Joined candidates upto Round II of All India Quota or State Quota shall not be eligible to participate in the further rounds for All India Quota or State Quota from the academic year 2022-2023 onwards as per the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India vide order dated.31.03.2022 in W.P.(c).No.174 of 2022 and DGHS guidelines issued in Ref.No. U/12021/01/2022–MEC, dated.12.07.2022.

"Kindly note that Medical Counselling Committee of DGHS MoHFW has developed Software for all the participating States / Counselling Authorities for NEET-UG to upload the name and Roll numbers of students who have joined upto Round-II and further Rounds of the State Quota or Round-II of the All India Quota on the common portal."

II. ROUND 1 OF ONLINE COUNSELLING:

- a) The candidates should pay a non-refundable amount of Rs.500/- (Rupees Five hundred only) towards Registration Fee via Bank payment portal and register for Round 1 of Counselling.
- b) A candidate who has not registered in the Round 1 of online counseling will not be permitted to attend round 2 of online counselling.
- c) It is advisable that candidates may choice lock all Colleges or most number of colleges where they wish to join (Category wise) in Round 1 as per their own preference.
- d) Not Choice Locking any college in a Category will lead to OPT OUT of colleges in that particular category in Round 2 of counselling.

For Example: If a candidate has not choice locked for any college in Category B (Self financing Medical College) in Round 1, He/She will be considered to have opted out for the category and will not be shown any choice in Category B in round 2.

- e) A candidate who has taken a seat and Not Joined/Resigned the course within the stipulated time will be eligible to attend the subsequent rounds of online counselling for the academic year 2023-2024.
- f) Re-allotment is permitted only during the Round 2 of counseling based on rank following the Rule of Reservation.
- g) If a candidate fails to join the College within the stipulated time, in the Round 1 of counselling he/she will be permitted to participate in the Round 2 of online counselling.
- h) The remaining unavailed seats of Persons with Benchmark Disability quota will be added to the General Category in Round 1 of counselling.

III. ROUND 2 OF ONLINE COUNSELLING:

Since Round 2 is a reallottment round no fresh registration is permitted for this round.

- a) The candidates who wish to retain the college taken in first round of online counseling need not participate in second Round of counseling.
- b) Candidates should be careful while choice filling and it is advisable to choose preferred colleges only.
- c) Candidate could edit their Choice(s) but once the candidate locks his/her choice(s) during the online counselling, it cannot be changed later.
- d) If the candidate is Re-allotted in Round 2, then the MBBS/BDS seat allotted to him/her during Round 1 of Counselling will be allotted to other candidates in descending order, not in ascending order.
- e) If the candidate has Not-joined the course after completion of Round 2 of Online counselling will be eligible to attend the subsequent phases of online counselling for the academic year 2023-2024, But he/she will have to forfeit the Registration Fee / Security Deposit & Tuition Fee paid by him/her.
- f) If the candidate has Joined but Discontinued the course after completion of Round-2 of Online counselling will be eligible to attend the subsequent phases of online counselling for the academic year 2023-2024, But he/she will have to forfeit the Registration Fee / Security Deposit & Tuition Fee paid by him/her and have to pay the discontinuation fee as per clause 23.

- g) If the candidate who opts out of any category in Round- I of Counselling, he/ she cannot claim the seats in any of the medical/ dental colleges in that category which were opted out during Round- I of counselling for choice locking in Round-II.
- h) Virtual vacancies: Any candidate who has been allotted a seat in Round 1 and has opted for up-gradation in Round 2 that allotted seat of Round 1 will be shown as virtual vacancy in Round 2 and candidates can fill their choice for the said seat during the choice filling in Round 2. However, such seats will be allotted in Round 2, only if the allottee of Round 1 vacates/upgrades in Round 2. When that virtual vacancy becomes real vacancy.

- j) Seats vacant due to not joining / resignation by candidate(s) allotted in Round-1.

- Candidates who registered and choice locked in Round-1 but did not get any seat.
- m)Candidates who have joined at allotted medical/dental College during round-1 of allotment.
- n) Candidates who have not joined the allotted seats during Round-1.
- o) Candidates who have joined and resigned their seats in Round-1.

NOT ELIGIBLE CANDIDATES FOR ROUND-2:

- p) Candidates, who have not registered in Round1 of online counselling.
- q) Candidates whose names are in the joined list provided by MCC at the end of All India Round -2.

IV. MOP-UP round of ONLINE COUNSELLING:

When a candidate is scheduled to attend the Mop-Up online counselling, then the candidate has to pay the Registration Fee of Rs.500/-(non-refundable) via online Bank payment portal. The candidates who have already paid the registration during previous rounds of counselling need not pay again if they have not been allotted seats.

Downloading of allotment order by the candidate (After payment of Tuition Fee) is considered as joining the college/Seat and the candidate has to report to the

institution within the reporting time. Failure to report will be considered as discontinued and the candidate should pay the Discontinuation fee as per Clause 23.

AVAILABLE SEATS FOR MOP-UP:

- (a) Non-allotted seats after Round-II of Counselling.
- (b) Seats vacant due to not joining / discontinuation by candidate(s) allotted after Round-II of Counselling.

ELIGIBLE CANDIDATES FOR MOP-UP:

- (c) A Candidate not holding any MBBS/BDS seats under All India Quota and State Quota will be allowed to participate in State Quota Mop-up counselling.
- (d) The candidates who participated in Round- 1 and Round –2 but not- allotted any seats are eligible to State Quota Mop-up counselling.
- (e) The candidates who were allotted a seat in Round- 1 and Not-joined/ Resigned the seat before the stipulated date and also Participated in Round- 2 but notallotted any seat are eligible to State Quota Mop-up counselling.
- (f) The candidates who were allotted a seat in Round- 1 and Not-joined/ Resigned seat before the stipulated time and also Not Participated in Round- 2 are eligible to State Quota Mop-up counselling).
- (g) If the candidate discontinues/ Not-joined the course after completion of Round-2 of online counselling, he/she will be eligible to attend the subsequent (Mop-Up) round of online counselling.

NOT ELIGIBLE CANDIDATES FOR MOP-UP:

- (h) As per DGHS notification Ref. U-12021/ 01/ 2022 -MEC dated 12.07.2022, a candidate joined under All India Quota or State Quota in the previous rounds will not be allowed to State Quota Mop-up counselling.
- (i) Candidates whose names are in the allotted list provided by MCC at the end of Mop-up Round.
- (j) If a candidate is allotted during State Mop-Up round, he/she will have to join the allotted college. Allotted candidates during Mop-Up round will not be eligible for Subsequent Stray Vacancy round.

V. STRAY ROUND OF COUNSELLING:

- a. Stray Round of Counselling will be conducted by the Selection Committee as per the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme court in in its order dated 12.12.2022, and also as per the guidelines of MCC/DGHS.
- b. Candidates who are not holding any seats in MBBS/BDS course will be eligible to participate in this Counselling.

- c. Candidates who have joined in All India and State Quota seats for MBBS/BDS will not be eligible to participate in this Counselling.
- d. Downloading of allotment order by the candidate (After payment of Tuition Fee) is considered as joining the college/Seat and the candidate has to report to the institution within the reporting time. Failure to report will be considered as discontinued and the candidate should pay the Discontinuation fee as per Clause 23.
- VI. i) If it is found that a candidate has involved in impersonation / suppression or misrepresentation of facts and production of falsified / bogus certificates by the candidates, his / her provisional allotment order will be cancelled and legal proceedings / criminal action will be initiated
 - ii) If during the NEET 2023 or at any stage of allotment /admission process of Medical / Dental Admission In Tamil Nadu 2023-2024 or in the admission process of Medical / Dental course In Tamil Nadu 2023-2024 at the allotted College have indulged in any case of impersonation i.e. not matching the photograph /signature / documents of the candidates etc., he/she shall be handed over to the Police by the Dean/Principal/The Director of Medical Education as the case may be and the cases shall be dealt as per the Indian Penal Code in this matter for further investigation. Such candidates will be debarred permanently from appearing for the Medical / Dental Admission in Tamil Nadu in future in addition to the cancellation of his/her candidature in the medical admission in Tamil Nadu of the year.
 - iii) The Selection Committee will not be responsible for approvals obtained/annual renewals and other applicable statutory approvals of various authorities including National Medical Commission/ Dental Council of India, infrastructure and the rules and regulations of the Self Financing Private Medical / Dental Colleges. Hence, candidates are advised to go through the respective college websites and National Medical Commission/ Dental Council of India websites and satisfy themselves before giving their option for selection of such seats by the candidates. The Selection Committee shall neither be responsible nor shall entertain any case on the above grounds.
 - iv) MBBS / BDS Seats in Government / Self Financing Medical / Dental Colleges are subject to routine renewal and approval of the National Medical Commission / Dental Council of India. Therefore, allotment will be made to the Colleges for which National Medical Commission / Dental Council of India / Government of India / Government of Tamil Nadu / The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University permission is available on the date of counselling. Allotment will also be made for the newly sanctioned colleges, if any, within the cut-off date.

- v) Seat matrix for Government Medical and Dental Colleges and Govt. Quota seats in Self Financing Medical / Dental Colleges will be released in the website before counselling and any addition of Colleges / Seats will be displayed at the time of counselling.
- vi) Conditions laid down in this Prospectus are applicable for the candidates who seek admission to Government Medical / Dental Colleges and ESIC Medical College, K.K.Nagar, Chennai affiliated to the Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R Medical University, Chennai and Government Quota in Self Financing Colleges.
- vii) Any existing / new college getting recognition from the National Medical Commission/ Dental Council of India will be included at the time of counselling.

18. COUNSELLING PROCEDURE:

1. Admission on preferential basis (7.5 percentage) as per the Tamil Nadu Admission to Undergraduate Courses in Medicine, Dentistry, Indian Medicine and Homeopathy on preferential basis to students of Government Schools Act, 2020 (Tamil Nadu Act No.34 of 2020).

As per the relevant provisions of the Tamil Nadu Admission to Undergraduate Courses in Medicine, Dentistry, Indian Medicine and Homeopathy on preferential basis to students of Government Schools Act, 2020 (Tamil Nadu Act No.34 of 2020), seven and a half per cent (7.5%) of seats in the admission to M.B.B.S. course and other medical courses, for which the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test is prescribed as the qualifying examination have been set apart, on preferential basis to students of the State Government schools who have qualified in the said Test.

- 2. The Act states as follows: -
 - (a) "Government" means the State Government, -
 - (b) "Government seats" mean, -
 - (i) all the seats in M.B.B.S., B.D.S., BSMS, BASMS BUMS and BHMS courses in Government Colleges, excluding the seats reserved for All India quota; and
 - (ii) 65 per cent of seats in M.B.B.S., B.D.S., BSMS, BASMS BUMS and BHMS courses in non-minority educational institutions and 50 per cent of seats in minority educational institutions, or the seats as arrived at in accordance with the consensus between such institutions and the Government:
 - (c) "Government schools" mean and includes Government schools, Corporation schools, Municipal schools, Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare schools, Kallar

- Reclamation schools, Forest Department schools and other schools managed by Government departments;
- (d) "Students studied in Government schools" mean children who have studied from Sixth Standard to Higher Secondary Course in a Government school and qualified in the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test.

Explanation- For the purpose of this definition, children belonging to weaker section and disadvantaged group who have studied upto eighth standard in a specified category school or an unaided school, as per clause (c) of sub-section (1) of section 12 of the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009 and studied all remaining standards up to Higher Secondary Course in a Government school and qualified in the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test, shall be deemed to be 'Students studied in Government schools';

- (e) "Minority educational institution" means an educational institution recognized or declared as such by the Government, subject to such conditions as may be prescribed:
- (f) "M.B.B.S., and B.D.S., courses" means the first year of Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery and Bachelor of Dental Surgery;
- (g) "National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test" means the Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test conducted by the authority designated under the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956, the Dentists Act, 1948, Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Regulations, 1986 and the Homeopathy (Degree Course) Regulations, 1983 for admission to M.B.B.S., B.D.S., and all disciplines courses, respectively;
- (h) "private school" means a school which is not a Government school.
- 3. Notwithstanding anything contained in any law for the time being in force and subject to section 5, seven and a half per cent of the Government seats shall be set apart on preferential basis to students studied in Government schools.
- 4. Students studied in Government schools shall also be entitled to compete for the Government seats, other than those set apart on preferential basis, along with the students who studied in private schools.
- 5. Admission of students studied in Government schools on preferential basis under section 3 shall be made by following the reservation as per the law in force.
- 6. Notwithstanding anything contained in section 3, where adequate number of students studied in Government schools are not available for admission to the seats set apart on preferential basis, such unfilled seats shall be filled up with the students who studied in private schools".

(i) The selection will be made based on NEET – UG 2023 score and by Single Window counselling following the rule of reservation by the Government of Tamil Nadu asfollows: -

Open Competition – 31 %
Backward Class – 30 %
Most Backward Class – 20 %
Scheduled Caste – 18 %
Scheduled Tribe – 01 %

- Within the 30% reservation for Backward Classes, 3.5% will be provided for Muslims.
- 2. 16% of seats out of the 18% quota earmarked to Scheduled Caste shall be allocated to the Arunthathiyar Community as per Tamil Nadu Act No.4 of 2009 dated 12.03.2009.
- 3. Reservation applicable at the time of counselling will be followed.

BC, BCM, MBC / DNC, SC, SCA, and ST candidates are eligible for selection under Open Competition as per rank in addition to the reservation made for those categories."

- a) Any remaining unfilled seats for want of adequate number of eligible candidates belonging to SCA community shall be filled by candidates belonging to SC community other than Arunthathiyar as per merit and vice versa. (GO (Ms) 55 P & AR Department, Dated:08.04.2010)
- b) Any remaining reserved seats in ST Quota for want of adequate number of eligible candidates belonging to ST community shall be allotted to candidates belonging to SC Community as per merit. (GO (Ms) No.77 Health & Family Welfare Department (MCA1) Dated 24.02.2011).
- c) Any remaining unfilled seats in BCM Community for want of adequate number of eligible candidates after exhausting the merit list shall be filled up on merit basis by candidates belonging to BC community without exceeding the quota for BC community as a whole (G.O.Ms.No.30/H&FW Dept(MCA1) Dated 18.01.2012)
- d) Even after filling up of the required seats reserved for Arunthathiyars on preferential basis, if more number of qualified Arunthathiyars are available, such excess number of candidates of Arunthathiyars shall be entitled to compete with the Scheduled Castes other than Arunthathiyars in the inter-se merit among them (As per G.O.Ms.No.65, P & AR (K) Department, Dated:27.07.2009.
- 7. Each UG medical seat(MBBS/BDS) is a precious resource. In order to avoid such seats becoming vacant and to give opportunities for more students from Government Schools under 7.5% Preferential category, students who have availed such reservation are not allowed to exit UG Medical (MBBS/BDS) seats. If any candidate who has availed 7.5% Preferential Reservation discontinues the course(MBBS/BDS) after the stipulated time in Round 1 or any time subsequently after (During or after the Counselling Process) they have to pay Discontinuation Fee as mentioned in the

clause 20 and also have to pay the amount which the Government has incurred on their educational expenses (Tuition Fees/Hostel Fees/Mess Charges/ University Fees/ Other Fees).

19. COUNSELLING DETAILS:

- a) Counselling Schedule will be made available on the official websites.
- b) Candidates should participate in the counselling session as per their rank and schedule.
- c) Candidates are instructed to visit the official websites frequently for updates.

- d) Candidates can choose a course at any college and exercise their option as per their eligibility norms mentioned in this prospectus.
- e) Rules will apply as applicable for the Government quota seats as per the prevalent National Medical Commission / Dental Council of India, rules and regulations, State Policy and the relevant rules of Institutions applicable to the Government quota seats of Self Financing Medical / Dental Institutions and the orders of the Hon'ble Court wherever applicable.
- f) Individual intimations will not be sent to the candidates regarding counselling. The candidates are therefore advised to check the official websitesfrequently till the end of counseling.
- g) Mutual transfer / Individual request for transfer to a College/Course will not be permitted under any circumstances.

- (i) Candidates who have selected Government quota seats in Self financing Medical /Dental Colleges & : SC / SCA / ST community whose parents' / guardians' annual income is less than Rs.2,50,000/- (Rupees Two lakh and fifty thousand only) are exempted from payment of all compulsory, Non-refundable Fee (Enrolment / Registration, Tuition, Games, Union, Library, Magazine, Medical Examination and such other Fee compulsorily payable by the scholar to the Institution or University / Board) and also exempted from all compulsory Non refundable fee fixed by the "Fee Committee". The Fee, so exempted shall be claimed by the respective Institutions under the Scholarship Programme of the Government of India, as per G.O.(Ms)No.6, Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Department, dated 09-01-2012 and G.O.(Ms)No.51, Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Department, dated 07-08-2013.
- (ii) Candidates who have selected Government quota seats in Self financing Medical /Dental Colleges & : Scheduled Caste converted to Christian Community whose parents'/ guardians' annual income is less than Rs.2,00,000/- (Rupees Two lakhs only) are exempted from payment of all compulsory, non-refundable fee (Enrolment / Registration, Tuition, Games, Union, Library, Magazine, Medical Examination and such other Fee compulsorily payable by the scholar to the Institution or University / Board) and also exempted from all compulsory non-refundable fee fixed by the "Fee Committee". The fee, so exempted shall be claimed by the respective Institutions under the Scholarship Programme of the Government of India. G.O. (Ms.) No.92, Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Department, dated 11.09.2012.
- (iii) After receipt of the joining report from the Deans of the respective colleges, the Tuition Fee amount will be transferred to the concerned colleges. This fee is refundable only in Round 1 if the candidate Not Joins/resigns before the stipulated date. If the candidate does not join the Institution, in or after Round 2he / she has to forfeit the amount paid while getting the provisional allotment order and that allotted seat will automatically stand cancelled. The candidates who discontinue the course beyond the stipulated date in Round 1 or any time in later rounds will also forfeit the Tuition Fee paid at the time of counselling.

23. DISCONTINUATION FEE:

➤ The candidates who discontinue the course after the permitted resignation date in Round-I or anytime in later should pay the Discontinuation Fee of **Rs.10,00,000/**by means of Demand Draft drawn in favour of "The Secretary, Selection Committee, Kilpauk, Chennai-10" payable at Chennai.

- ➢ If a candidate selects a seat in final stray round of counselling and does not join the course within the stipulated time, then the candidate has to pay the Discontinuation Fee by means of Demand Draft drawn in favour of "The Secretary, Selection Committee, Kilpauk, Chennai-10" payable at Chennai and has to forfeit the Security Deposit &Tuition fee.
- ➤ The admission to MBBS / BDS Degree Courses for 2023-2024 will close on the cut-off date of admission as per the guidelines issued by the National Medical Commission / Dental Council of India.

24. DURATION OF THE COURSES: -

M.B.B.S.: 5½ years including one year Compulsory Rotatory Resident Internship.

B.D.S. : 5 years including one-year Compulsory Rotatory Resident Internship.

25. The selected candidates should produce all the original documents at the time of admission to the Deans / Principals of the concerned Medical / Dental Colleges. The Selection will be cancelled if the candidates do not produce the original documents at the time of admission.

26. BOND: -

- a) The candidates selected for admission to MBBS / BDS Degree Courses and his / her parent/guardian will have to execute an Agreement Bond during admission to the College as prescribed in Annexure-IX. Failure to execute the Agreement Bond will lead to cancellation of selection.
- b) The candidates who discontinue the course beyond the end of counselling on the year of admission and on any date in subsequent years should pay a sum of Rs.10, 00, 000/- (Rupees Ten Lakh Only) as discontinuation Fee as mentioned in the clause 23.
- 27. The candidates selected for admission and his / her parent / guardian will have to sign the discipline declaration form in Annexure XIV. Failure to sign the declaration will result in the cancellation of selection.
- 28. After the cut-off date for admission, as per the guidelines issued by the National Medical Commission / Dental Council of India / Directorate General of Health Services, admission / re-allotment shall not be made including the seats surrendered under All India Quota.
- 29. All selections and admissions for MBBS / BDS Course are only provisional. The selection and admission is liable to be cancelled at any time as and when the eligibility conditions are found to be defective or incorrect or there has been suppression or misrepresentation of facts. The Selection Committee reserves the right of allotment of MBBS / BDS seats.

30. HEPATITIS-B VACCINATION: -

All candidates selected for admission to first year MBBS / BDS Degree Courses should take the Hepatitis-B Vaccine before admission and produce a certificate as in Annexure - X.

31.RAGGING:-

The candidates who join MBBS / BDS Degree Courses should not indulge in any kind of agitation / strike / ragging activity inside / outside the college campus during the course of study. The candidates if found to take part in any such activities mentioned above will be expelled from the course / college at any part of the course of study and legal proceedings / criminal action will be initiated against them as in Annexure XI.

32. The candidates applying for MBBS / BDS Degree Course 2023–2024 session are deemed to have read the contents in the Prospectus and agree with all conditions / clauses and will not have the right to challenge any of the clauses contained in the Prospectus and agree that the same is binding upon them

33.FAQ'S REGARDING COUNSELLING PROCESS

Q.No.1: How to apply for UG(MBBS/BDS) Medical admissions in Tamilnadu?

Ans: After the NEET-UG 2023 results are out, there will be notification in the websites (tnhealth.org & tnmedicalselection.org) for application to UG medical admissions in Tamilnadu. Candidates are advised to login using their Mobile No (For OTP) and creating unique User ID and Password. Candidates are advised to read this prospectus carefully and apply through the website in Online mode only.

Note: Cost of applying online: Rs.500/- (SC/SCA/ST candidates are exempted)

Q.No. 2: I have applied online. Is this enough for getting a seat?

Ans: No. Applying online is just the first stage in the entire process. Once all the applications are received and scrutinized Eligible Merit List of Candidates (Candidates who have applied and are found eligible) will be published in the websites. After this Candidates have to register for the counseling process as mentioned in the scheme of counseling.

Q. No. 3: How do I register for the counseling?

Ans.: After the Merit List is published candidates have to register before the onset of counseling by paying the non-refundable registration Fee of Rs.500/- in the website after logging in using the same credentials (User ID, Password, Mobile No) used during the application process. Registration is allowed before Round 1, Mop-Up Round and Stray Round and Fresh registration is not allowed before Round 2 (as this is a re-allottment round)

Note: Registration is allowed only for already applied candidates who are in the Eligible Merit list and not for those candidates who have not at all applied to TN Medical Selection.

Q. No. 4: How and when I had to make the payment?

Ans: After logging in for fresh registration, payment page appears automatically. Candidate can do online payment by Net Banking / credit card/ debit card. Only after the successful payment candidate can proceed for choice filling.

Q.No. 5: How do I fill the Choice filling form on website?

Ans: Candidates will have to log on to website https://tnmedicalselection.net/ to get registered and then fill in choices. Please study counseling scheme carefully. It is advised that after going through the list of seats available, a tentative list may be prepared first, as per your preference of colleges, before attempting to fill choices online. Candidates are advised to read and understand the prospectus completely before filling their choices.

Q. No. 6: Is there any restriction for filling up number of choices of Institution (College) (and courses i.e. MBBS or BDS) in choice filling form?

Ans: No, you can give as many choices as you wish during online choice filling. However, choices should be in order of your preference. There will be a common software for Government Quota/Management Quota/NRI Quota/Minority Quota/ NRI Lapsed seats for filling up of choices. The choices will be available based on your eligibility and application.

For example: A Telugu Minority candidate who has applied for Management quota will be shown TM MQ seats but the same seat will not be available for General MQ applied candidate and also If a Telugu Minority candidate has not applied for Managemnt Quota he will not be shown TM MQ or other MQ seats at all.

Q. No.7: Is it necessary to fill up the choices and lock the choices to get seat allotted? Or I will be allotted seat automatically from leftover seats?

Ans: After online registration (registration is compulsory to take part in online allotment process, before the counselling rounds during specified registration period), you have to fill in choice of Institutions/colleges/courses in order of your preference. Once choice is filled in, it can be modified before locking it. If candidate does not lock the choice submitted by him/her, the choices already filled will be automatically locked as per counselling schedule.

Note: If the candidate does not fill choices for any college, he/she will not be allotted any seat during the counseling

IMPORTANT:

Don't wait till the last minute to Register and Lock your choices. Please go through your submitted choices before locking, as once you lock the choices they cannot be modified or changed even if you have made a mistake. It may result in allotment of a seat which you never wanted. (Please note that the choices once locked cannot be unlocked even by the Selection Committee)

- Q. No. 8: Is it necessary to join allotted Medical/Dental College of Round 1 to get chance to participate in Round 2?
- Ans: No, candidates need not report or join the allotted college of Round 1 since there is free exit.
 - However, if they want to retain the Round 1 seat and upgrade in round 2 they have to physically join the college of Round 1 and participate in Round 2 online.
- Q. No. 9: Can a candidate participate in Round 2 without submitting fresh choices (based on choices submitted before round-1)?
- Ans: Fresh choice submission by eligible candidates, as mentioned above is necessary for consideration for seat allotment during any round. If candidate does not submit fresh choice(s) during choice filling period, the candidate will not be considered for allotment of seat during Round- 2 and will retain the already joined seat, if any.
- Q. No.10: If a candidate does not report at the allotted college during Round 2 whether he has to register again for Mop Up round?
- Ans: Yes, the security Deposit and Registration Fee paid already will be forfeited and he has to register fresh in Mop Up round with Fresh Payment.
- Q. No.11: If I opt to participate in second round of counseling whether my allotted seat (of first round) will be cancelled?
- Ans: In case you are not allotted any seat in the second round, you will retain earlier allotted seat in Round 1 if you had joined already. However, on reallottment of a seat

in second round, the earlier allotted seat in Round 1 will automatically be cancelled and allotted to another candidate. Therefore, you are advised to fill in only choices which you prefer over the earlier allotted seat, for second round.

Q. No.12: After I join Second Round of Counseling of AIQ can I leave/ Resign to join State Quota seat?

Ans: Once you join second round seat, you will not be allowed to vacate from allotted 2nd round seat as per direction by Hon'ble supreme court in WP(C) (267/2017) dated 09/05/2017.

However, if you are allotted a seat in Second Round and have not joined the college/institute you can Exit with Forfeiture of security deposit and Tuition Fee.Vide Order dated 22/07/2022 in Contempt Petition No. 289 of 2022 before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India it has been approved that MCC of DGHS has developed a software for all participating states and counselling authorities for the NEET-UG/PG in order to ensure that the names and roll numbers of candidates who have joined up to round 2 and further rounds of the state quota or round 2 of AIQ are put up on the common portal. Moreover, the candidates who have joined up to round 2 of AIQ or State quota shall not be eligible to participate in the further rounds of AIQ or state quota from the academic year 2022-23. Furthermore, it has been directed by the Hon'ble Court that:

"The development of the above software should ensure that a uniform pattern is followed by all the States across India commencing from the academic year 2022-2023. For the current academic year, since the students have already joined and the courses have commenced, we would, in the interest of justice, put an end to the contempt proceedings. However, we take on record the assurance which has been set out by the DGHS and direct that all the States and counselling authorities in the NEET- UG/PG shall scrupulously comply with the above directions from the academic year 2022-2023."

Therefore, not joined candidates in Round 2 of AIQ or SQ will be allowed exit with forfeiture and allowed to participate in further counseling process for 2023-2024 whereas Joined candidates will not be allowed to participate in further counseling for the current year 2023-2024.

Q. No. 13: - What is the procedure for Mop Up Round Counseling which will be conducted by Tamil Nadu Medical Selection Committee?

Ans. The net vacant seats due to Not allotted/non joining, non reporting of Round 2 and any converted seats due to lack of candidates in the particular quota will be

published in the seat matrix and eligible candidates have to **submit fresh choices** and the result will be processed as per Choice & Merit applying the rule of Reservation.

Q. No. 14: - Whether reallottment is allowed from 2nd round counseling of AIQ /State Quota to Mop-up Round counseling of State/AIQ quota?

Ans. No, reallottment is not allowed once a candidate joins a seat allotted in Round 2 of AlQ or State Quota and the candidate will not be allowed to vacate the seat. The candidate will not be allowed in any further counseling including Stray Vacancy Round.

Q. No. 15: How much time will I be given to join the allotted college?

Ans: Candidates allotted seats will be required to join the allotted college/course within the stipulated time which is mentioned in counseling schedule. However, candidates are advised to join as early as possible and not to wait for last day of joining, due to different schedule of holiday (including local holidays) / working hours in various Medical / Dental Colleges. Therefore, candidates are advised to contact allotted college immediately after declaration of result of counseling allotment process, to know the details. If candidate fails to join the allotted Medical/Dental College within stipulated time, then the allotted seat will be cancelled. For Mop-Up Round and Stray round as there is very little time for the entire counseling process and there is no process of reallotment/resignation, downloading of allotment order after payment of Tuition Fees will be considered as Joined. But the candidate has to report to the allotted college within the stipulated time. If the candidate does not report he/she will be treated as Discontinued and his seat will be considred vacant and he/she will have to pay the discontinuation fee as mentioned in clause 23 in addition to forfeiture of security deposit and Tuition Fees.

Please note that under no circumstances date of joining/date of reporting can be extended by the Selection Committee.

Q. No. 16: What documents are required at the time of Joining/ Reporting in allotted Medical/ Dental College?

Ans: Original documents (along with attested photocopies of documents) for admission to under- graduate medical/dental courses for admission to allotted college are required at the time of joining in allotted Medical / Dental College are as mentioned below.

- i. NEET- UG 2023 Admit card and Score card.
- ii. Class X Mark Sheet (both sides of Certificate).
- iii. Class XI Mark Sheet (both sides of Certificate).

- iv. H.S.C. Mark sheet (both sides of Mark Sheet) or any other equivalent examination.
- v. Transfer certificate obtained after the completion of H.S.C. or equivalent courses.
- vi. Certificate for proof of study from VI Std. to XII Std for the candidates who have studied completely in Tamil Nadu.
- vii. Community Certificate. (if applicable)
- viii. Nativity certificate.
- ix. Documents of Parents need to be uploaded for the candidates who claim their native as Tamil Nadu as follows:
 - b) Community Certificate of either one of the parentsobtained from the competent Revenue Authority in Tamilnadu (Who claims communal reservation)
- Q. No. 17: What are the various fees to be paid during the counseling process?
- Ans: At the time of submission of application online students have to pay a non-refundable A.Application Fee of Rs.500/- only (Exempted for SC, SCA & ST candidates).

 - All candidates who are allotted seats have to pay the Tuition Fees (As mentioned in clause 22) online to download the allotment order.
- Q. No. 18: In case candidate had to apply for both Govt quota in SF Colleges and for management quota should the candidate pay the fee for both?
- Ans. Yes. As per the policy, the candidate has to pay both the fees. In this case the candidate will have to pay fee for GQ in SF Colleges. Rs. 30000/- plus for MQ Rs. 1,00,000/- as security deposit in addition to the registration Fees Rs.500/-.
- Q. No. 19: What does exit with forfeiture mean in 2nd round?
- Ans: Exit with forfeiture means if a candidate is allotted a seat in 2nd round and does not want to join the allotted seat he can still exit with forfeiture (losing security deposit)

and once candidate has joined the allotted seat he/she would not be eligible for resigning of joined seat.

Q. No.20: When and where this Security Deposit will be refunded?

Ans:

- Security amount will be refunded only after the completion of all rounds of Counseling. Selection Committee will notify about the completion counselling on their portal. The Refund Process will be completed within 60 days of such notification.
- 2. The security amount will be refunded to the account ,specifically mentioned by the candidates in the application form.

Hence, the candidate must keep the said bank account ACTIVE till the refund process is completed. If bank account is closed before the completion of refund, the bankers will not be able to complete the refund process. The bankers will take long time to identify & return the failed refunds to Selection Committee and lot of legal formalities are to be complied for initiating refund to a different bank account. Hence the refund to new bank account will take very long time. Neither Selection Committee nor the Banks will be responsible for such delay.

- Q.NO.21: Do I have to request the Selection Committee to refund the security amount? What Is the schedule for refund of security amount?
- Ans: No. Candidate need not approach the Selection Committee for refund of security amount. The Selection Committee will publish the list of candidates who are eligible for the refund of security amount on their portal "https://tnmedicalselection.net/" once all rounds of counseling are completed. The Selection Committee will initiate the refund of security amount within 45 days and complete the refund of security deposit within 60 days of publishing the eligible list in the Web Portal.

The refund will be credited, depending upon the level of digitalization of candidate's bank, to the candidates account between 2 to 15 days from the date of refund by the Selection Committee.

- Q. No.22: Will the Selection Committee bear the bank charges incurred by the candidate while registering for counseling?
- Ans: No. Bank Charges if any, incurred by the candidate should be borne by the candidate only.
- Q. No.23: Will the Selection Committee pay interest on the refundable security deposit?

Ans: No. The Selection Committee will not pay interest on the refundable security deposit.

Q. No. 24: If I forget my password that I have created during the process of registration, how to retrieve it?

Ans: To retrieve the forgotten password, system facilitates the following process:

The candidate is required to enter the information that he/she filled at the time of registration and then security question & answer thereon to be entered as given during New Candidate registration process. The above data submitted by candidate will be validated with the registered candidate's database. If the above entries match, then only the candidate would be permitted to enter new password to proceed further.

Q. No. 25: Difficulty in login, what may be the problem(s)?

Ans: Please read user manual for the candidates. Follow the instructions about use of browser, use of same spellings. The internet connection should be uninterrupted. In such case, please try to login from other computer having uninterrupted internet connection from which other candidate(s) has logged in successfully.

Q No. 26: I have difficulty in creating Password, what may be the problem(s)?

Ans: Creation of password should be as per password policy. Please follow the password policy. Please use the internet browser as suggested in user manual, as it is difficult to login from some of the other browsers. While creating password avoid using Caps Lock key, instead of Caps Lock key, use shift key.

Q. No. 27: When I try to login for choice filling/ submission, it says wrong password, what may be the problem(s)?

Ans: This can happen if password typed is incorrect. Password is case sensitive, therefore use password which was created by user exactly same as typed while creating. In case password is forgotten, try to retrieve password by using security question and its answer.

IMPORTANT:

Please keep the information same as that you have furnished on the application form confidential, and do not share the password and OTP with anybody as to register for online allotment process and submit choice you need that information. If somebody else uses that information, he/she can misuse your online registration and prevent you from taking part in online allotment process. Keep print out of application form ready for reference with you.

4. (a) For International Tournaments:

Category-I: Olympics, World Cup / Commonwealth Games, Asian games (Games organised in FOUR years frequency by the International Olympic Committee).

Category – II :A minimum of six countries must have been participated for International tournaments which are not covered under Category I and such tournaments should have been approved by Indian Olympics Association (IOA), Sports Authority of India (SAI) and Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports (MYAS), Government of India.

Open or Invitational or Memorial or any indifferent nomenclature or title of tournaments or Championships at International level, not approved by any of the above authority will not be considered for marks.

- 1. Participation or achievement in International tournaments will be considered only with earlier achievements at National and State level tournaments. Direct participation in any International or National tournaments will not be considered for award of marks.
- The highest achievement in only one annual regular tournament, officially conducted ina regular mannerby the member National Olympic Committee (NOCs) authorized by the International Olympic Committee (IOC) or InternationalSports Federations affiliated to the IOC will be considered for award of marks. The Players/ Sports person representing the Country in such tournaments through Indian Olympic Association (IOA) or respective National Sports Federations recoginsed by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India or IOA will be considered for award of marks in each year.
- Only tournaments officially recognised by the Indian Olympic Association / respective official National Federations will be considered for the award of marks (for each year) from 01.06.2019 to last date of submission of application (01.06.2019 to 31.05.2020, 01.06.2020 to 31.05.2021, 01.06.2021 to 31.05.2022 and 01.06.2022 to last date of submission of application).
- 4. Certificates of Participation or Achievements in tournaments, submitted along with Form I alone are eligible for marks indicated in Table (I) above(should be submitted before the last date of submission of application).
- 5. Players who participated in any of the categories I and II, in Table (I) should produce the copies of the following:-
 - (a) VISA, Immigration entry in passport, clearance from Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports (Government of India), Indian Olympic Association and respective National Sports Federations including BCCI.
 - (b) The fixture, draw, schedule of events, players' accreditation, National Medal, Merit, Diploma, Participation certificate and Form-I issued by the respective National Sports Federation and certificates signed and issued in the prescribed format by the President or Secretary General of the National Olympic Committee of the Organising Country and International Federation.

(b) For National Tournaments

1. National tournaments should have been officially be recognized as the regular annual championship/ tournament by MYAS or IOA or SAI or SDAT or respective official National

Sports Federation will be considered (for each year) for theaward of marks.

- 2. Marks will not be awarded for selection trials and coaching camps.
- Tournaments conducted by the Federations which are not recognised by the IOA or MYAS, TNOA or SDAT at National level for a particular period will not be considered for award o marks.
- 4. Candidates must have participated at Zonal, District, Divisional, National and International in a

particular Game / Sport in the same hierarchical order as per the existing norms applicable for

a particular Game / Sports.

(c) For State Tournaments

- 1. State level tournaments should officially be recognised as the regular annual championship or tournament by respective official State Association or SAI or SDAT will be considered (for each year) for the award of marks.
- 2. Marks will notbe awarded for selection trials and coaching camps.
 - 3. Any tournaments conducted by the Associations which are de-recognised by the TNOA or SDAT at Statelevel for a particular period will not be considered for award of marks.

(d) For CBSE / KV Schools Sports Achievements:-

- (i) The number of KV and CBSE Schools, when compared to State Board School in Tamil Nadu, is
 - very less. Hence, the cluster level achievements are not considered.
- (ii) The candidates participated in the tournament conduced by CBSE and KV Schools, at Regional / South Zone are equated to Divisional Level Achievement, and the National Level Achievements are equated to State Level of State Board Schools.

5. General Conditions

- For consideration of candidates seeking admission under the category of eminent sports person, he / she should enclose all the attested photocopies of participation certificates and the relevent forms issued by the competent sports authorities. The application along with all the sports certificates / relevant forms /documents as given in 4(a) 5, should be submitted in person at office of the Secretary (TNEA), Anna University, Chennai Applications received through post will not be considered.
- 2. Participation / achievements in each academic year from 01.06.2019 to last date of submission of application (01.06.2019 to 31.05.2020, 01.06.2020 to 31.05.2021, 01.06.2021 to 31.05.2022 and 01.06.2022to last date of submission of application) in sports / games shown in the list alone will be considered for the award of marks. National or State Level Championships or Tournaments conducted by Sports Federations or Associations recognised by MYAS or IOA or SDAT or TNOA alone will be considered for the award of marks. (Recognition of State Associations / National Federations should be relevant to the year concerned).
- 3. Relevant attested copies of certificates issued by the competent authorities as detailed below are to be submitted along with the application before the last date for receiving the applications.

- 7. Direct participation or achievement at any level without participating in the qualifying level competitions such as District or State or National or direct selection conducted by District or State Sports Association or National Sports Federation to represent the District or State or National or International tournaments or championships will not be considered for award of marks.
- 8. For International achievements in Tennis, marks for Gold, Silver and Bronze will be awarded to players who are ranked first, second and third respectively in the ATP or WTA rankings of International Tennis Federation for awarding participation marks for the top **5 ranked** players will be considered from the ATP or WTA list published by the International Tennis Federation. Necessary document and proof should be enclosed by the candidate.
 - For National or State level achievement in Tennis, marks for Gold, Silver, Bronze will be awarded to players who are ranked first, second and third respectively in the AITA or TNTA at National or State. For awarding participation mark the top 5 ranked players will be considered from the list published by AITA or TNTA at National or State level based on the ranking. Necessary document and proof should be enclosed by the candidate.
- 9. All other sport disciplines in which ranking is the criteria for assessment of achievement, rules indicated in item 8 above will be applicable for award of marks.
- 10. For Cricket, the annual official Championships or tournaments conducted within the country under the auspices of TNCA or BCCI at District or State or National Level alone will be taken into consideration for that year.
- 11. Multiple events in a particular sport must be standardised events and in accordance with the events organised by the approved International Federations. Events newly created and not in accordance with the requirement will not be considered for award of marks.
- 12. Participation or achievements of candidates with nativity of Tamil Nadu who represented Tamil Nadu alone are eligible for marks under National Category.

- 13. Only Tamil Nadu candidates are eligible to apply for admission under Sports Quota and only the KVS and CBSE schools within Tamil Nadu are eligible for marks.
- 14. A Common Committee for Engineering and Medicine constituted for this purpose will rank the candidates based on the marks assigned to the certificates enclosed along with the application. Candidates with a minimum sports mark of 5 and above alone will be considered for ranking.

- 21. Short listed candidates will be called for counsellingbased on their rank and branches and Colleges will be allotted according to their choices from the number of seats reserved under sports quota based. Sports quota counselling will be held before the commencement of general counselling.
- 22. Candidates securing admissions under Eminent Sports Persons quota should sign an undertaking at the time of receiving allotment order assuring participation in sports activities in the college preferred by them.
- 23. Legal action would be taken on parents and candidates for furnishing bogus documents. They should ensure that the certificates obtained are from competent authorities.
- 24. A candidate can utilise the Sports Ouota only once for Engineering or Medicine.

MEDICAL COUNCIL OF INDIA NOTIFICATION

New Delhi, the 3rd August, 2009 No. MCI-34(1)/2009-Med./25453

Implementation of the Regulations framed by the Medical Council of India to curb the menace of ragging in Medical Colleges.

The operative part of the regulation is reproduced as under with regard to curb the menace of ragging in medical colleges:-

- "5. Measures for prohibition of ragging:-
- 5.1 The Medical College/Institution / University shall strictly observe the provisions of the Act of the Central Government and the State Governments, if any, or if enacted and / or for the time being in force, considering ragging as a cognizable offence under the law at par with rape and other atrocities against women and ill-treatment of persons belonging to the SC/ST and prohibiting ragging in all its forms in all institutions.
- 5.2 Ragging in all its forms shall be totally banned in the entire Medical College/Institution / University including its departments, constituent units, all its premises (academic, residential, sports, canteen, etc) whether located within the campus or outside and in all means of transportation of students whether public or private.
- 5.3 The Medical College/Institution / University shall take strict action against those found guilty of ragging and/or of abetting ragging.
- 6. Measures for prevention of ragging at the institution level:-
- 6.1 Before admissions:-
- 6.1.1 The advertisement for admissions shall clearly mention that ragging is totally banned / prohibited in the Medical College/Institution and anyone found guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging is liable to be punished appropriately.
- 6.1.2 The brochure of admission/instruction booklet for candidates shall print in block letters these Regulations in full (including Annexures).
- 6.1.3 The "Prospectus" and other admission related documents shall incorporate all directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court and /or the Central or State Governments as applicable, so that the candidates and their parents/ guardians are sensitized in respect of the prohibition and consequences of ragging.
- 6.1.4 A Brochure or booklet/leaflet shall be distributed to each student at the beginning of each academic session for obtaining undertaking not to indulge or abet ragging and shall contain the blueprint of prevention and methods of redress.

The application form for admission/ enrolment shall have a printed undertaking, preferably both in English/Hindi and in one of the regional languages known to the institution and the applicant

(English version given in Annexure I, Part I), to be filled up and signed by the candidate to the effect that he/she is aware of the law regarding prohibition of ragging as well as the punishments, and to the effect that he/she has not been expelled and/or debarred from admission by any institution and that he/she, if found guilty of the offence of ragging and/or abetting ragging, is liable to be punished appropriately.

6.1.5 The application form shall also contain a printed undertaking, preferably both in English/Hindi and in one of the regional languages known to the institution and the parent/ guardian (English version given in Annexure I, Part II), to be signed by the parent/ guardian of the applicant to the effect that he/ she is also aware of the law in this regard and agrees to abide by the punishment meted out to his/ her ward in case the latter is found guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging.

A database shall be created out of affidavits affirmed by each student and his/her parents/guardians stored electronically, and shall contain the details of each student. The database shall also function as a record of ragging complaints received.

- 6.1.6 The application for admission shall be accompanied by a document in the form of the School Leaving Certificate/transfer certificate/migration certificate/ Character Certificate which shall include a report on the behavioral pattern of the applicant, so that the institution can thereafter keep intense watch upon a student who has a negative entry in this regard.
- 6.1.7 A student seeking admission to the hostel shall have to submit additional undertaking in the form of Annexure I (both Parts) along with his/ her application for hostel accommodation.
- 6.1.8 At the commencement of the academic session the Head of the Institution shall convene and address a meeting of various functionaries/agencies, like Wardens, representatives of students, parents/ guardians, faculty, district administration including police, to discuss the measures to be taken to prevent ragging in the Institution and steps to be taken to identify the offenders and punish them suitably.
- 6.1.9 To make the community at large and the students in particular aware of the dehumanizing effect of ragging, and the approach of the institution towards those indulging in ragging, big posters (preferably multicoloured with different colours for the provisions of law, punishments, etc.) shall be prominently displayed on all Notice Boards of all departments, hostels 4 and other buildings as well as at vulnerable places. Some of such posters shall be of permanent nature in certain vulnerable places.
- 6.1.10 Apart from placing posters mentioned in sub-clause 6.1.9 above at strategic places, the Medical College/Institution shall undertake measures for extensive publicity against ragging by means of audio-visual aids, by holding counseling sessions, workshops, painting and design competitions among students and other methods as it deems fit.

- 6.1.11 The Medical College/Institution/University shall request the media to give adequate publicity to the law prohibiting ragging and the negative aspects of ragging and the institution"s resolve to ban ragging and punish those found guilty without fear or favour.
- 6.1.12 The Medical College/Institution/University shall identify, properly illuminate and man all vulnerable locations.
- 6.1.13 The Medical College/Institution/University shall tighten security in its premises, especially at the vulnerable places. If necessary, intense policing shall be resorted to at such points at odd hours during the early months of the academic session.
- 6.1.14 The Medical College/Institution/University shall utilize the vacation period before the start of the new academic year to launch wide publicity campaign against ragging through posters, leaflets. seminars, street plays, etc.
- 6.1.15 The faculties/ departments/ units of the Medical College/Institution /University shall have induction arrangements (including those which anticipate, identify and plan to meet any special needs of any specific section of students) in place well in advance of the beginning of the academic year with a clear sense of the main aims and objectives of the induction process.

The Principal or Head of the Institution/Department shall obtain an undertaking from every employee of the institution including teaching and non-teaching members of staff, contract labour employed in the premises either for running canteen or as watch and ward staff or for cleaning or maintenance of the buildings/lawns etc. that he/she would report promptly any case of ragging which comes to his/her notice. A provision shall be made in the service rules for issuing certificates of appreciation to such members of the staff who report ragging which will form port of their service record.

6.2. On admission:-

6.2.1 Every fresher admitted to the Medical College/Institution/University shall be given a printed leaflet detailing when and to whom he/she has to turn to for help and guidance for various purposes (including Wardens, Head of the institution, members of the anti-ragging committees, relevant district and police authorities), addresses and telephone numbers of such persons/authorities, etc., so that the fresher need not look up to the seniors for help in such matters and

get indebted to them and start doing things, right or wrong, at their behest. Such a step will reduce the freshers" dependence on their seniors.

Every institution should engage or seek the assistance of professional counselors at the time of admissions to counsel `freshers' in order to prepare them for the life ahead, particularly for adjusting to the life in hostels.

- 6.2.2 The Medical College/Institution/University through the leaflet mentioned above shall explain to the new entrants the arrangements for their induction and orientation which promote efficient and effective means of integrating them fully as students.
- 6.2.3 The leaflet mentioned above shall also inform the freshers about their rights as bonafide students of the institution and clearly instructing them that they should desist from doing anything against their will even if ordered by the seniors, and that they have nothing to fear as the institution cares for them and shall not tolerate any atrocities against them.
- 6.2.4 The leaflet mentioned above shall contain a calendar of events and activities laid down by the institution to facilitate and complement familiarization of freshers with the academic environment of the institution.
- 6.2.5 The Medical College/Institution/University shall also organize joint sensitization programmes of 'freshers' and seniors.

On the arrival of senior students after the first week or after the second week as the case may be, further orientation programmes must be scheduled as follows (i) joint sensitization programme and counseling of both 'freshers' and senior by a Professional counselor; (ii) joint orientation programme of 'freshers' and seniors to be addressed by the principal/Head of the institution, and the anti-ragging committee; (iii) organization on a large scale of cultural, sports and other activities to provide a platform for the 'freshers' and seniors to interact in the presence of faculty members; (iv) in the hostel, the warden should address all students; may request two junior colleagues from the college faculty to assist the warden by becoming resident tutors for a temporary duration.

- 6.2.6 Freshers shall be encouraged to report incidents of ragging, either as victims, or even as witnesses.
- 6.3. At the end of the academic year:-
- 6.3.1 At the end of every academic year the Dean/Principal/Director shall send a letter to the parents/guardians of the students who are completing the first year informing them about the law regarding ragging and the punishments, and appealing to them to impress upon their wards to desist from indulging in ragging when they come back at the beginning of the next academic session.
- 6.3.2 At the end of every academic year the Medical College/Institution /University shall form a "Mentoring Cell" consisting of Mentors for the succeeding academic year. There shall be as many levels or tiers of Mentors as the number of batches in the institution, at the rate of 1 Mentor for 6 freshers and 1 Mentor of a higher level for 6 Mentors of the lower level.

Each batch of freshers should be divided into small groups and each such group shall be assigned to a member of the staff. Such staff member should interact individually with, each member of the group on a daily 6 basis for ascertaining the problems/difficulties if any faced by the fresher in the institution and extending necessary help.

In the case of freshers admitted to a hostel it shall be the responsibility of the teacher in charge of the group to coordinate with the warden of the hostel and to make surprise visits to the rooms in the hostel where the members of the group are lodged.
